### **Clinic Tutors are required to:**

- provide effective clinic-based learning opportunities and experiences for student osteopathic practitioners to facilitate their development of the knowledge, skills and attitudes required in osteopathic practice.
- encourage and promote the use of a range of approaches that reflects the breadth of the curriculum for the appropriate osteopathic care and management of patients and the Osteopathic Practice Standards.
- ensure that students produce full and accurate records of their clinical findings, actions and other data promptly, in a coherent, comprehensive and accessible means using the relevant and acceptable notations.
- support the students to explore and develop the rationale behind their clinical reasoning.
- supervise and guide students in the preparation of professional letters and communications when required.
- act as a role model to students promoting ethical, reflective, efficient and effective osteopathic practice at all times.
- monitor and supervise each patient encounter to ensure maximum benefit and safety to all patients and students under supervision.
- actively support students and participate in all aspects of the student clinical assessment programme including the provision of constructive and timely feedback on their clinical performance. This includes completion of CA6s
- have a good awareness and understanding of the overall M.Ost programme, and how the Clinical Practice modules sit within this.
- fulfil administrative responsibilities and be familiar with all (including student) ESO policies and procedures:
  - observe health and safety requirements within the Clinic including the Fire Evacuation procedure.
  - abide by the conditions of confidentiality concerning the disclosure of patient, staff and student data and details.

- participate in staff appraisal, training and development and peer support activities. This includes the completion of Equality and Diversity and Safeguarding Training which are a requirement of this role.
- Participate in relevant meetings including faculty meetings and moderation meetings
- be prepared to cover for colleagues (when reasonable to do so) in cases of unplanned absence and offer temporary supervision to students.
- be registered with the GOsC as a practicing osteopath.
- ensure an atmosphere is maintained in the clinic that is conducive to learning.
- liaise closely with the Senior Clinic Team in the development of clinical education, including identifying students at risk of failing clinic assessments, at risk of harming themselves or patients or who are behaving in a manner not expected of ESO students.

Anything else that may reasonably be required to assist in the running of the business, consistent with the role of a Clinic Tutor during your normal sessions.

## GRADE E2

A Clinic Tutor at Grade E2 will meet one or more of the following criteria:

Have three years relevant teaching experience

Have a teaching qualification or relevant post-grad qualification
